The BComm program is comprised of 39 units of junior/200-level courses.
Students may complete up to 30 units in Year 1 of the BComm program.

Notes:

- ¹ The 200-level ENGL course should be completed in either the Fall or the Winter term of Year 1.
- ² MATH 249 or MATH 265 should be completed in either the Fall or the Winter term of Year 1. MATH 249 is for students who have not completed MATH 31 (or equivalent high school Calculus). MATH 265 is for students who have completed MATH 31 (or equivalent high school Calculus).
- ³ MGST 217 and SGMA 217 may be completed in either the Fall or the Winter term of Year 1. It is recommended that these courses be taken in separate terms.
- ⁴ A recommended option sheet is available at the Undergraduate Programs Office or online at haskayne.ucalgary.ca/current-students/undergraduate/academic-information/advising.
- ⁵ Students intending to pursue the BComm Honours Program should plan to complete DATA 201 and UNIV 201 to satisfy two Junior Non-Commerce Options.
